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COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Engineer's Report:

Township Engineer Briglia issued a report on projects going on within the township. He informed the Committee that there was a Pre-Bid meeting held on November 20th for USDA Pump Station project and that bids will be received on December 6th. Mr. Briglia also stated that the Lincoln Avenue project has been completed. The design for Hilltop Road has been completed and they are awaiting Department of Transportation approvals. The Schoolhouse Lane project has been completed and approval of the Energy Audit is on the horizon. Deeper Life Bible Church appears to be making progress. Discussions regarding the SCADA System upgrade have determined that a new system is needed since the existing one is antiquated. Public Works Manager Micklasavage explained that a new system is needed to get our system up to date to ensure that water and sewer alarms are able to function.

Administrator's Report:

Township Administrator Danson detailed the success of the Mayor's Wellness Campaign and the "Fit for Fall" program that was implemented for all Township employees, noting that the Township received recognition in the JIF newsletter. Activities included a massage chair, a picnic in the park, and free blood pressure screenings. Ms. Danson also discussed a successful "Make a Difference Campaign" meeting where the Director of Downtown Hammonton presented ideas to attract businesses. In closing, Administrator Danson reminded residents of the Holiday House Decorating Contest, the livestreaming of meetings, and the efforts the Township is making to 'Go Green' (including installing a new television in the Court Room to project meeting agendas).

Committeewoman Sura's Report:

Committeewoman Sura reported that the Board of Education and Superintendent Dr. Harring are working hard to ensure the students receive the best education. PARCC scores have shown improvement and the schools will be introducing a new report card style. Ms. Sura reminded residents that there will be a joint Board of Education/ Township Committee meeting on November 30th. Ms. Sura also reported that the Public Works department has been very busy with leaf collection. She reminded the residents of the leaf collection schedule as well as the hours of the pit on Columbia Avenue. The Public Works Department is also working on the tennis courts at Thomas Richards and the exhaust fans at the Senior Citizen Center.

Committeeman Ferguson's Report:

Committeeman Ferguson reminded residents that the Waterford Township Civic and Events Association will be hosting their annual Winter on the Avenue event on December 2nd from 5:00 through 9:00 PM. Mr. Ferguson also commented that the Public Works department has been repairing cracks in the Dek hockey rink at Waterford Elementary School and have painted temporary lines on the tennis courts at Thomas Richards School. The permanent lines will be completed in the spring.

Committeeman Giangiulio's Report:

Committeeman Giangiulio delivered the Waterford Township Police Department report noting that they were dispatched to over 1000 calls for service in the month of October, including 3 DUI arrests. Officers also participated in Breast Cancer Awareness Month by wearing pink badges in the month of October. Mr. Giangiulio reported that the Office of Emergency Management has been working with the WTEC on the Firewise Program. He noted that the Firewise Program has been well received by residents and thanked Terri Chiddenton and Dave Chiddenton for their dedication to the program. Committeeman Giangiulio also informed the residents that an emergency kit was purchased to be kept at the Senior Citizen's Center.

Mayor Richardson's Report:

Mayor Richardson reported that leaf collection is on schedule. He reminded the residents that no brush would be picked up until Spring, although the Columbia Avenue pit will be open for brush. Mr. Richardson also noted that Fire Hydrants are being flushed throughout the Township. He congratulated the Public Works department for having their new roadside tractor on display at the New Jersey League of Municipalities conference. Mayor Richardson concluded his report by wishing all residents a happy and safe Thanksgiving.

CAPITAL ITEMS:

1. **USDA Water and Sewer Infrastructure (ARH #7701041)**
The advertisement for bids has been published and a pre-bid meeting has been scheduled for November 20, 2017. Bids will be received and opened on December 6, 2017. There is significant interest in the project from contactors and approximately a dozen bid packages have been purchased to date. We will keep the Township Committee advised of status on a periodic basis.
2. **FY2016 NJDOT – Lincoln Avenue Improvements (ARH #7704007)**
The project construction is complete with all outstanding items addressed. Our office has commenced project close-out and reimbursement procedures for the project. We will keep the Township Committee advised of status on a periodic basis.
3. **FY2017 NJDOT – Hilltop Road Improvements (ARH #7704009)**
Preliminary plans were submitted to the Township and NJDOT for approval to advertise for bids. We await NJDOT approval to move forward with a bid advertisement for the project. We will keep the Township informed of project design status.
4. **FY2018 NJDOT – Local Aid Applications (ARH #P2017.0538)**
We submitted the NJDOT 2018 Municipal Aid applications through NJDOT SAGE for municipal aid funding in 2018. We will periodically inform the Committee of application status and any monetary awards.
5. **Schoolhouse Lane Improvements (ARH #7704010)**
The contractor has completed the road paving and concrete curb. We will perform a final site walk-through inspection and prepare a punch-list if necessary. We will then move forward with post construction administrative items for project close-out.
6. **Township Municipal Building Emergency Generator – (ARH #7701049)**
We are in the process of project design and will submit preliminary design plans for discussion with Township Officials. We will then proceed to a final design. We will periodically inform the Township Committee of plan and specification progress.
7. **Township Public Safety Building (ARH #5152211)**
Site improvements are nearly complete. We will contact the site contractor, CCIA, and Township Officials to schedule a final site walk through-inspection and if need be prepare and submit a punch-list for final outstanding items. We will keep the Township Committee and Department of Public Works informed periodically of any progress.
8. **Local Government Energy Audit (ARH #7701000)**
The TRC Project Associate for the LGEA Program advised that the “bill analysis” would be complete by October 20, 2017. We have not received an application approval to date and we have contacted the NJDPU for advice on how to expedite

this process. We await advice from the NJDPU and will keep the Township Committee informed of any progress.

9. Township SCADA System Upgrade (ARH # P2017.0520)

We developed a draft proposal for the cost to upgrade the Township SCADA system. We will finalize the proposal and submit it to the Township Committee for their consideration.

10. CCMUA Loan Program (ARH #7705001.01)

There are no new program development updates per Andy Kricun of the CCMUA. We will advise the Township of any changes in program status.

ESCROW ITEMS:

11. ALI Services, LLC – Site Plan (ARH #7710021.01)

We received a request from the Township to review the performance guarantee estimate for the project. We will review the estimate to assure the performance guarantee amount and the amount of the construction inspection escrow. We will submit a letter to the Township stating acceptance of the calculated amounts or any further recommendations from our office.
