X. COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Engineer's Report

Engineer Rehmann noted that Mr. Loughney is working to get the plans for the Ritter Complex improvements approved by the Pinelands and hopes they will be able to go out for bids soon. Engineer Rehmann reported that they are in the process of modernizing the wastewater pump station and that a grant from the USDA is helping to defray the costs. The design of Trout Drive and Genessee Avenue is underway and being funded by the NJDOT. Hilltop Road Improvements have

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been completed with the exception of clean-up work. Mayor Richardson requested that they be vigilant in getting approvals for the new hockey rink at Ritter.

Committeeman Giangiulio's Report

Committeeman Giangiulio delivered the EMS report for the month of May and noted that they were called out 63 times throughout the month. He also noted that they have been holding trainings including CPR classes and EMT refreshers. Mr. Giangiulio then read the Waterford Township Fire Department Report noting that they went out on 50 calls in the month of May. Committeeman Giangiulio delivered the Office of Emergency Management report and noted the importance of the community being supportive of the FireWise Safety Plan.

Committeeman Yeatman's Report

Committeeman Yeatman reported that the sports fields and Township grounds are in great shape. He also noted that the Waterford Township Civic and Events Association have begun mailing out sponsor packets to area businesses in hope of getting support of their annual Winter on the Avenue event.

Committeeman Giangiulio interjected that the SJ Magazine ranked Waterford Township as #15 overall and #5 in Camden County as best towns.

Committeewoman Sura's Report

Committeewoman Sura reported on the Construction and Zoning office and detailed the fees collected by each. She also noted the amount collected by the Vacant Property Registrations. Ms. Sura reported on a successful Fishing Derby hosted by the Waterford Township Environmental Commission and HOFNOD (Hooked on Fishing, Not on Drugs). She noted that it was a fun day and that the hard work of the volunteers is much appreciated.

Committeewoman Hanna's Report

Committeewoman Hanna reported that she would be attending a meeting with Bowman and Company regarding the audit on June 21st. Ms. Hanna also shared that the Township Newsletter is nearing completion and that residents should look for it in their mailboxes in the coming weeks. She thanked Ms. Danson, Department heads, and staff for their efforts.

Mayor Richardson's Report:

Mayor Richardson reminded residents that Public Works is no longer collecting leaves, although residents are welcome to bring them to the Public Works building on Burnt Mill Road. Mr. Richardson also noted that brush is still being collected. Mayor Richardson informed residents that Public Works has already put out more than 8 tons of patch to repair the potholes. Mayor Richardson concluded his report by stating that the old Forte property will still be demolished although it is currently on hold because of the need to clean up asbestos.

XI. OPEN MEETING TO THE PUBLIC: (FOR AGENDA ITEMS ONLY)

The Mayor opened the meeting to the public for comments.

Jim Foley of 479 Raritan Avenue thanked the Township Committee for getting involved with the EMS. Mr. Foley feels that he has made a lot of progress with the EMS and feels that there has been a new resurgence of volunteers. Township Committee thanked him for all of his hard work and dedication to the EMS.

John Wooten of Carriage Lane expressed concerns regarding the condition of Carriage Lane. He explained that he spoke to Township Engineer Rehmann and is hopeful that the road will be repaved rather than just spot fixed. Mr. Wooten also complained that the road is dangerous and hazardous especially since there are no sidewalks on the road and that residents must walk on the side of the street. Mr. Wooten inquired regarding plans to fix the road and Mayor Richardson explained that they

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must consider the cost and options.

Chuck Thomas of Carriage Lane expressed appreciation for the way the Township honored its Police Department at the beginning of the meeting. Mr. Thomas also noted that he moved to the Township 2 years ago and that Carriage Lane is progressively getting worse. He noted that he hopes it is repaired.

Chiquita Reddick of Carriage Lane detailed her frustration with the deteriorating conditions of Carriage Lane. She said she has lived there for 16 years and has spent a large amount of money repairing vehicles that get damaged from traveling on the road.

Hillary Walker spoke on behalf of her parents whom have lived on Carriage Lane for over 40 years. Ms. Walker noted that every time she cuts her parents' grass, she find large pieces of asphalt in the lawn. She also noted that she does not believe filling the holes will fix the issues. Ms. Walker also noted that she appreciated how the Township honored its Police Department.

Al Beck of Oakwood Lane inquired regarding a Police report for the month of May. Committeeman Giangiulio apologized that he did not have it on-hand.

The Mayor closed the meeting to the public for comments.

CAPITAL ITEMS:

1. **USDA Water and Sewer Infrastructure (ARH #7701041) - No Status Change**
The contractor, TKT Construction Co., Inc., is on schedule to start physical construction at Pump Station #1 on June 18th at the latest, with the other two stations starting at approximately 60-day intervals thereafter. We will keep the Township Committee informed periodically of the project's progress
2. **Ritter Field Improvements (ARH #7701053)**
ARH is responding to site plan comments made by the Pinelands Commission. We are coordinating with our subconsultants to refine our lighting and power supply layout. We are coordinating items with the township to stay on schedule.
3. **FY2018 NJDOT – Local Aid Applications (ARH #7704004)**
ARH has received approval from the Township Committee to provide engineering services including survey and preparation of contract documents, design and specification services for improvements to Trout Drive and Genessee Avenue. Survey of the areas has begun. ARH will keep the Township Committee informed periodically of our progress.
4. **FY2016 NJDOT – Lincoln Avenue Improvements (ARH #7704007)**
Correction work on the road has been completed. ARH will complete any closeout measures necessary with the NJDOT and keep the Township informed on the progress.
5. **FY2017 NJDOT – Hilltop Road Improvements (ARH #7704009)**
Main construction of the roadway and handicap ramps has been completed. The road was inspected and a list of issues has been submitted to the contractor for corrections. We will keep the Township Committee advised on the status of the work as it progresses.
6. **Township Municipal Building Emergency Generator – (ARH #7701049) – No Status Change**
ARH has submitted a proposal for to Township Committee for construction management services. The performance bond is being prepared by the contractor, Dee-En, and will be submitted when it is ready. We will keep notify the Township when the contracts are returned.
7. **Township Public Safety Building (ARH #5152211) – No Status Change**
ARH submitted plans and specifications to the CCIA for quotes to complete final items. We will keep the Township Committee and Department of Public Works informed periodically of any progress.
8. **Local Government Energy Audit (ARH #7701000) – No Status Change**
We were advised that the LGEA application is near approval and scheduling an audit is eminent.

9. **Waterford MUA Rules & Regulations Update (ARH # 7701052) – No Status Change**

The Township Committee authorized our office to perform the required revisions to documents. In addition to revising the Rules and Regulations Document, we are also clarifying the construction details. We are planning to meet with Township Administrator, Township Solicitor and DPW to discuss proposed revisions and to ensure revisions are coordinated properly.

10. **Water Quality Accountability Act Compliance (ARH # P2017.0798) - No Status Change**

We have been working with the Township IT and DPW staff gathering information of the Township's water system security status. We will be submitting the information to the DEP when they have their submission portal ready. This plan is required by the NJDEP and pursuant to the requirements of the NJ Water Quality Accountability Act. The Cyber Security Plan had a submittal deadline of February 16, 2018 but is postponed until the DEP portal is activated. The Asset Management Plan is due by April 2019.

ESCROW ITEMS:

1. **ALI Services, LLC – Site Plan (ARH #7710021.01) - No Status Change**

We submitted a Performance Bond amount recommendation letter to the Township for consideration. We will schedule a pre-construction conference with all respective parties when the performance bond is posted and the construction services escrow account is established,

2. **Deeper Life Bible Church (ARH #7712010)**

The proposed site improvements have been completed. ARH has completed the Certificate of Occupancy inspection and submitted its report to the Township Construction Official.

3. **2432 Acorn Drive Sump Issues – No Status Change**

ARH performed a field inspection at the property. A recommendation letter was issued to the Construction Code official outlining a recommendation for repair and a cost estimate for said repairs.

4. **Waterford Pines**

ARH attended the meeting on Wednesday June 6, 2018 between the developer, township and the homeowners association. The matter is under discussion between the party's attorneys.
