TRASH/GARBAGE CARTS:

Shall be placed curbside before 5:00 am on your scheduled day. Trash carts must be Township issued. Every property is allowed a maximum of 2 Trash carts. ALL TRASH MUST BE IN CART WITH THE LID CLOSED.

SINGLE STREAM RECYCLING CARTS:

Shall be placed curbside before 5:00 am on your scheduled day. Recycle carts must be Township issued. Every property is allowed a maximum of 2 Recycle carts. Aluminum cans, glass containers, plastic bottles, newspapers, junk mail and cardboard all in one cart. **NO PLASTIC BAGS FOR RECYCLED MATERIALS.** Do not tie papers or cardboard. ALL RECYCLE MUST BE IN CART WITH THE LID CLOSED.

METAL/WHITE GOODS:

Appliances, lawn mowers, grills, bed frames, a/c units, bicycles, file cabinets and any other metal items are picked up **every Tuesday**. To schedule a pickup, **you must call** the office by 3:00 pm on Monday. Metal/White Goods may also be brought to the Convenience Center for disposal on Saturday between the hours of 8:00 am – 12:00 pm

BULK TRASH:

Bulk Trash Collection is scheduled once a month, the last full week of the month on your normal trash day. (A full week consists of a Monday thru Friday with no holiday closures) Bulk trash must be placed at the curb in an orderly fashion.

ACCEPTABLE BULK ITEMS:

Bulk Trash consists of materials that are too large to be placed in your trash cart. Including but not limited to materials such as: furniture, lamps, toilets, carpet (rolled into a bundle 4' X 2' and tied), mattresses/box springs (bagged or wrapped in plastic). Smaller household items must be placed in a box not to exceed 40 lbs. in weight with a limit of 4 boxes.

****Glass must be removed from bulk items, placed in a box and marked glass.**

*****Residents are responsible for cleaning up any glass residue that may remain on the ground in front of their home as a result of collection.**

UNACCEPTABLE BULK ITEMS:

Bulk Trash Collection **does not** pick up household trash, bagged/extra can items, cardboard, auto parts, tires, pianos, spas, hot tubs, pool tables, vegetative waste, computers and computer related equipment, tv's, pallets, windows, hazardous materials, materials from a house cleanout, eviction, foreclosure, unoccupied properties, commercial properties, home renovations, or remodeling projects.

****Cardboard is a recyclable material and must be disposed of in your recycle cart**

BRUSH:

Brush and Yard Waste, **excluding** grass, are picked up the first full week, on your normally scheduled trash collection day, of each month during the months of March to November. Brush must be tied into bundles, not exceed 4 feet in length or placed in cans, not to exceed 50lbs and should be placed at the curb in an orderly fashion. The butt ends of branches should be facing the street. Tree rounds and large logs must be cut into firewood size pieces to be picked up. If you are Land clearing you must dispose of your debris elsewhere. **There is no need to call for a brush pickup.**

Brush not meeting the above specifications will not be picked up.

Residents may dispose of their own brush at the Waterford Township Public Works Yard at 790 Burnt Mill Road on Saturdays from 8:00 am to 12:00 pm. Residents will be required to show identification proving residency.

CONVENIENCE CENTER:

Our Convenience Center is located at 790 Burnt Mill Road and is open for residents with permits on Saturdays from 8:00 am – 12:00 pm. Permits for disposal can be obtained from the Clerk's office in Town Hall. The permit for disposal is free to Township residents.

ITEMS ACCEPTED AT THE CONVENIENCE CENTER.

Bulk items:

Furniture, lamps, mattresses, box springs

Construction debris:

For residents doing their own **small** remodeling jobs, we accept: doors, toilets, bathtubs, vanities, carpet/flooring

Metal:

Appliances, lawn mowers, grills, bed frames, air conditioning units, bicycles, file cabinets and any other metal items

E-Waste:

Televisions, Computers and computer related equipment

Brush:

Brush can be brought to the convenience center and does not have to meet the curbside regulations. Roots and root balls are not permitted. No land clearing debris.

Batteries

Lead acid batteries, laptop batteries, cell phone batteries, rechargeable batteries and car batteries.

****Alkaline batteries can be disposed of in regular trash.**

ITEMS NOT ACCEPTED:

Whole House/Garage clean outs, Contractor generated construction debris, large amounts of construction debris, bagged trash, household garbage, hazardous materials, paint, propane tanks, asbestos, bricks, asphalt, concrete, dirt, fencing, sheds, shingles/roofing material, tires, hot tubs, pianos, pallets, recyclable material (cardboard, all aluminum cans, plastic containers and glass bottles)
