Meeting called to order at 7:03 PM. This meeting was held in the Waterford Township Municipal

Courtroom. In accordance with Chapter 231 of the Open Public Meeting Act, notice of the time and

place for this meeting was listed in the Central Record and the Courier Post. The Sunshine Rule was

announced and the Pledge of Allegiance recited.

Reading and approval of minutes: Minutes from the May 2025 meeting were read.. Motion to accept

made by Kyle Santos; seconded by Craig Buffington. Minutes were accepted.

Old Business: (Rick Yeatman)

TREX Recycling: Rick has made arrangements with Acme for dropping off plastic. We will need to

purchase a scale and an outdoor drop-off container before collection begins. Estimated costs are

\$1500 for the container and \$300 for a scale.

Classroom programs: We are still waiting for a response from the State Fire Service about

educational programs aimed at 8-10 year olds on forest fires and forest regrowth. Unfortunately, they

have been busy fighting fires.

Chair's report: (Rick Yeatman)

Shredding Event: Our 5/17/25 Shredding Event was well attended, Rick thanked us all for our

participation.

Atco Lake: We are still waiting for Camden County to treat the lake with paddock specific herbicide to

kill off the lily pads. The County brought in an amphibious craft twice to cut down the paddock near

the shoreline. It was moderately successful; the watercraft experienced a number of mechanical issues.

Educational Programs: (Jennifer Treloar) Jennifer has been in contact with Waterford teachers, principals, and school board members about funding programs and supplies. Jennifer spoke with Assistant Superintendent Dan Fox, who suggested we come up with an application form to streamline the process. He provided samples from the Women's Club and the Home & School Association. Mr. Fox suggested that once we have an application and information form for teachers, teachers will submit to the School Board, who will then forward submissions to Jennifer.

Jennifer presented a proposed program "Seeds of Change: A Fifth Grade Environmental Innovation Project" from fifth grade teachers Heather DeNafo & Jessica Borman from Waterford Elementary School. (attached to the minutes) We have also heard from Atco Elementary School teachers Deanna Griffin and Jennifer Ercol about a pollinator garden. Jennifer has also spoken to Media Specialist Elizabeth Seth at Waterford Elementary School. She is working on a list of books for the WES library. Jennifer suggested that we switch our focus from creating material to be taught to funding projects and materials for teachers that will supplement their existing curriculum. Kyle Santos volunteered to assist with creating the application form.

Fishing Derby: Our Fishing Derby on 6/7/25 was a great success, despite the threat of rain. Over 52 fish were caught, with a total of 43 registered participants. The prizes were awarded as follows:
